FINDATA: One-stop shop for the secondary use of health and social data

Act on the Secondary Use of Health and Social Data

May 2019

Purpose of the Act:

- Facilitate the effective and safe processing and access to the personal social and health data
- Guarantee an individual's legitimate expectations as well as their rights and freedoms when processing personal data

What kind of data are available – and how

Data permit

- Findata started receiving applications **1.4.2020**
- Available in a remote access environment for a set period
- Direct identifying data removed



Data request

- Findata started receiving data requests 1.1.2020
- Data delivered to the customer

- Anyone can apply for the data also from outside Finland
- A data utilisation plan is always required to access data sets
- Data are available for the purposes specified in the Act

Customer path

By phone & email, detailed instructions on website (fin, swe, eng) • Help desk Information on data availability and quality \bullet National metadata catalogue in development \bullet Findata: Corresponds with the applicant if additional information \bullet **Application** \rightarrow Defining the final data request is needed Contacts the data controllers \rightarrow Cost estimate for the applicant **Customer:** orders the remote access environment for the analyses **Decision**/ **Data controllers:** sample the data, transfer them to Findata permit Findata: manages and pseudonymises the data **Data transferred** Findata: to the secure Provides the analysis tools in the remote access environment \bullet Controls the anonymity of the final results analysis • environment Removes/deletes the data when the permit expires (if not extended) \bullet

Received applications



- Total of 203 decisions by the end of January
- Data needs for Covid-19 prioritized

Granting the permits

Applications:

- Very few completely rejected
- Findata does *not* act as a scientific gatekeeper & evaluate the research plans per se if they abide by the law/Act and fall within the use purposes listed there, we will grant the permit
- Handling times:
 - Act: 3 months from application to decision (+ another 3 if needed in special cases)
 - From decision to delivering the data: on average maybe 1-2 months
 - Applications piled up at the moment: learning process for all involved
